#### **5. Goals/mission (from bylaws):**

The Standards Committee is a permanent committee that reports to the Board of Directors (BoD). Its main responsibility is to advise the Board of Directors (BoD) on the adoption of standards to be supported by CLARIN ERIC.

Its main tasks include:

- to collect, consolidate and prepare for publication in a single place its findings and recommendations related to standards;
- to maintain the set of standards supported by CLARIN and adapt them to new developments within or outside CLARIN;
- to publish and promote the standards supported by CLARIN;
- to develop and implement procedures for the discussion of recommendations and the adoption of new standards;
- to ensure harmonisation of standards between CLARIN ERIC and related initiatives;
- to ensure communication with international standards bodies such as (but not restricted to) ISO;
- to advise the BoD in all matters related to standards.

#### **6. Major activities, decisions and achievements:**

- The questionnaire on areas of specialization of CLARIN researchers has been filled out by the members and presented to the KSIC in the hope to constitute a resource useful to the CLARIN community in general, and to the CSC in particular, when the committee needs to reach out to experts for consultation.
- The first steps towards distilling a list of currently supported standards out of the KPI-related BoD research have been taken and will be continued in December and March meetings.

### TEI:

- Piotr Bański and Andreas Witt are convenors of the Special Interest Group “TEI for Linguists” (LingSIG)
- Tomaž Erjavec and Andrej Pančur from CLARIN.SI developed the first version of the Parla-CLARIN encoding recommendations, which specify a TEI-based schema for corpora of parliamentary proceedings. The proposal was presented at the TEI 2019 conference in Graz.

### OpenMinTeD:

- Penny Labropoulou and Marta Villegas are co-authors (with other collaborators from the OpenMinTeD) of the OMTD-SHARE ontology which includes a class dedicated to data formats; the work on the ontology is continued as part of the update of the META-SHARE ontology.

## 8. Outstanding themes/plans for 2019/2020

- Build on the synergy between the need to increase the KPI concerning standard/format information on the one hand, and the potential to exploit the KPI research for the purpose of gathering the statistics on formats/standards most supported by centres.
- Ensure that information about the past and current activities and achievements of the CSC is publicly accessible via the CLARIN.eu webpage
- Publish the first version of the standards and formats supported by CLARIN centres in a form that combines the information distilled from the KPI research with the parameters describing various aspects of how the given formats are used (after the March 2020 hands-on meeting)
